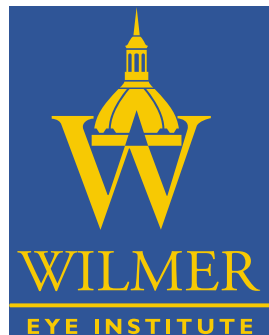

School Consequences of Visual Impairment

Common school problems include:

- 1. **Attendance** – Frequent absences – students struggle with the work more likely than non-impaired
- 2. **Reading** – Reading difficulties – work struggles may be more likely than non-impaired
- 3. **Behavior** – High or low behavioral activity levels due to sensory input or lack ability to understand it

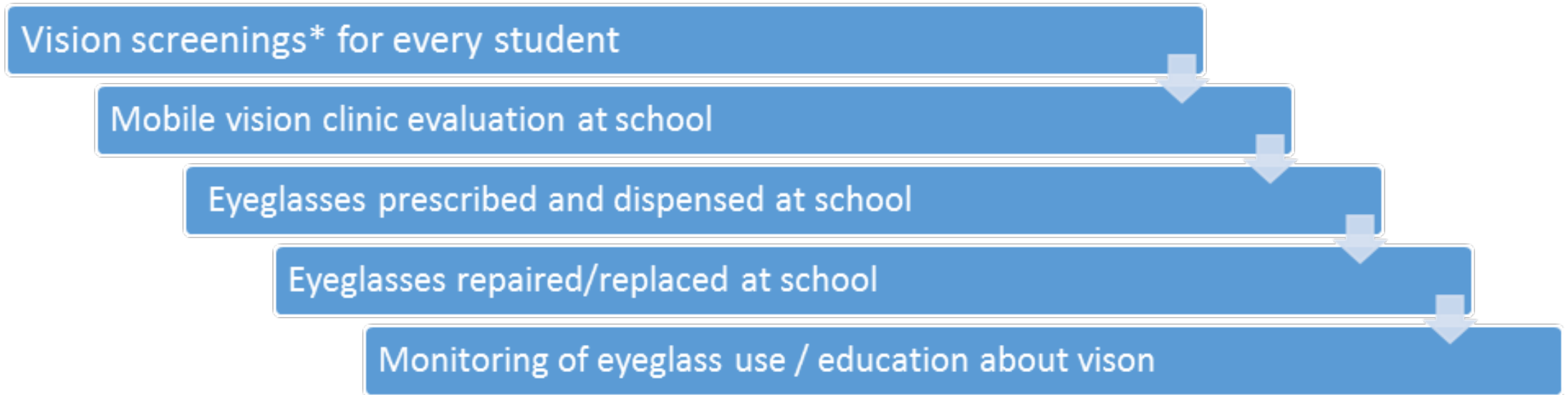
